

# Call for Proposals: Science Curriculum Internationalization

---

Course development awards are now available to support UW–Madison faculty and instructional academic staff members in the **sciences** who wish to incorporate **international** content into one or more **undergraduate** courses.

Awards, which provide up to \$10,000 in flexible funds, are for courses in the sciences.

Because these are 101 funds, **award monies (including salary transfer) must be spent by June 30, 2012.**

Content integration must be implemented within one year. Timeline can be extended for new courses that need to pass through curriculum committees.

Awards may be used for, but are not limited to, the following activities:

- new course/module development;
- existing course revision/supplementation;
- travel to a conference;
- travel to establish a study abroad program;
- hiring student/project assistant/post doc help to support the project;
- purchasing resources or other teaching aids;
- incorporating new technology;
- developing case studies or other content;
- hosting a visiting speaker.

Awards may not be used to purchase one-time use equipment or teaching assistantships.

Applicants must demonstrate how the award will *directly* lead to the integration of international content into one or more undergraduate science courses.

Science Internationalization Fellows (awardees) will be asked to present their projects at one or more upcoming events (e.g. a fellows' lunch, Delta roundtable, panel presentation at the Teaching & Learning Symposium) that support science curriculum internationalization.

Non-tenured faculty and academic teaching staff members are encouraged to apply. Collaborative efforts are of particular interest.

## Application:

Applications should be submitted electronically to Masarah Van Eyck, director of science curriculum internationalization, [mvaneyck@cals.wisc.edu](mailto:mvaneyck@cals.wisc.edu).

1. Please include full name, title/rank, department/school affiliation, and **contact information** (campus address, phone numbers, e-mail address).
2. In no more than three pages, **describe the project** for which funding is requested. Please include:
  - a. course name/number
  - b. semester(s) the course is to be taught
  - c. predicted enrollment per course (number of undergraduates to be impacted each year)
  - d. a timeline of project activities (demonstrate how funds will be spent before June 30, 2012)
  - e. projected *global learning outcomes*. See [this Web site](http://www.cals.wisc.edu/ip/AboutIP/IntlPrograms.html) for examples of global learning outcomes ([www.cals.wisc.edu/ip/AboutIP/IntlPrograms.html](http://www.cals.wisc.edu/ip/AboutIP/IntlPrograms.html)).
3. Please also include a **support letter** (e-mail is fine) from the department chair which speaks to the feasibility of the project.
4. Please include a **budget narrative** explaining how the Science Internationalization Course Development Award and any other funds will be used to support the project. Requests may be for less than \$10,000 but not for more.
