## How did you do?

- An average person eats 25 pounds of ice cream per year. That is equivalent to **80** cones in one year!
- On average, cows produce 7 to 8 gallons of milk per day, or about **120 glasses**. Wisconsin dairy cows produce nearly 10 gallons of milk per week for every man, woman and child in the state.
- Wisconsin produces **28%** of the nation's cheese supply.
- Wisconsin is home to more than 1.3 million dairy cows --- one cow for every **four** people!
- Approximately **90%** of Wisconsin's milk is used to make cheese.
- Wisconsin **does** rank **number one** in producing 303 million pounds of butter per year.
- **All of these.** Wisconsin produces 350 different types of cheeses, such as Gouda, Crowley, Cougar Gold, Brick, Cheddar, Mozzarella, and Swiss.
- An average dairy cow weighs about **1,400** pounds. You wouldn't want one to step on your toe!
- **Christopher Columbus** was the first person to bring dairy cattle to North America on his second voyage to the New World in 1493.
- Milk is about 87% water, so cows need to drink a lot — about **30 to 50 gallons** per day, depending on how hot the weather is and how much milk the cow is producing!
- **Wisconsin** is number two in milk production with 26.7 million gallons of milk per year. California is ranked number one.
